## Upcoming Hymns

The opening hymn in late worship this week, “The God of Abraham Praise”, uses a common Hebrew folk melody used in Jewish worship services for hundreds of years. It is even used in some synagogues in the Sabbath eve services today. The meaning of the text “points to the one and only Truth ‘who was, and is, and is to be, is still the same.’ Jesus quoted these words from Exodus: “I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.” He is God not of the dead, but of the living” [Matthew 22:31b-32]. The hymn proclaims the eternal nature and steadfast love of the living God. Likewise, it affirms that the word of God spoken to the prophets of old still speaks to us and to all generations to come.

The hymn text derives from the thirteen articles of Jewish faith codified in the 12<sup>th</sup> century and formed into a Doxology {“Yigdal” in Hebrew}. Welsh Wesleyan preacher Thomas Olivers, after hearing the “Yigdal” sung in a Sabbath eve service at a synagogue in London, asked the cantor to transcribe the tune for him. In turn, Olivers wrote an English metrical paraphrase with strong Christian overtones. The hymn was published in 1772, with Olivers naming the tune after Meyer Lyons, the cantor who translated it for him [Lyons stage name was Leoni]. The hymn seems to me to be a good musical link between the Old Testament and the New Testament.

I hope you enjoy another hymn new to us that is not in the hymnal entitled, “All Are Welcome” by Marty Haugen. We will sing a new verse from this hymn each week for the next few weeks. The main message this hymn emphasizes is found in the title, “All Are Welcome.” This is our church’s mission. It reflects the importance of the Disciples approach to communion that everyone is invited to participate fully in communion regardless of their previous Christian affiliation. Also, it puts forth the idea of building a place or “house of worship” where love can dwell and “all can freely live.”

I hope these songs enhance your worship experience.

## Caring & Sharing

Margo Thein conducted the meeting; she presented the group with valuable information on the protection of seniors from the "Grandparent Scam" which is becoming more and more prevalent in our aging society. According to a poll conducted by the "Caring for Seniors" newsletter, 58% of its readers knew a senior who had been victimized by fraud. Prevention methods were suggested: ask personal questions that only your real grandson would know the answer (i.e. "What did I give you for your birthday last year?") or establish a family code word. Anyone receiving such a call should hang up and notify the police.

The group also had a discussion about the importance of becoming aware of the "signs of depression" among seniors. Seniors are the most likely group to be at risk of depression's negative effect on mind, body and spirit. The good news is that depression is very treatable with counseling, medication, as well as lifestyle changes. One of the important lifestyle changes should be increasing physical activity; this raises the levels of chemicals in the brain that make us feel better and have a good day.

## Fellowship Dinner

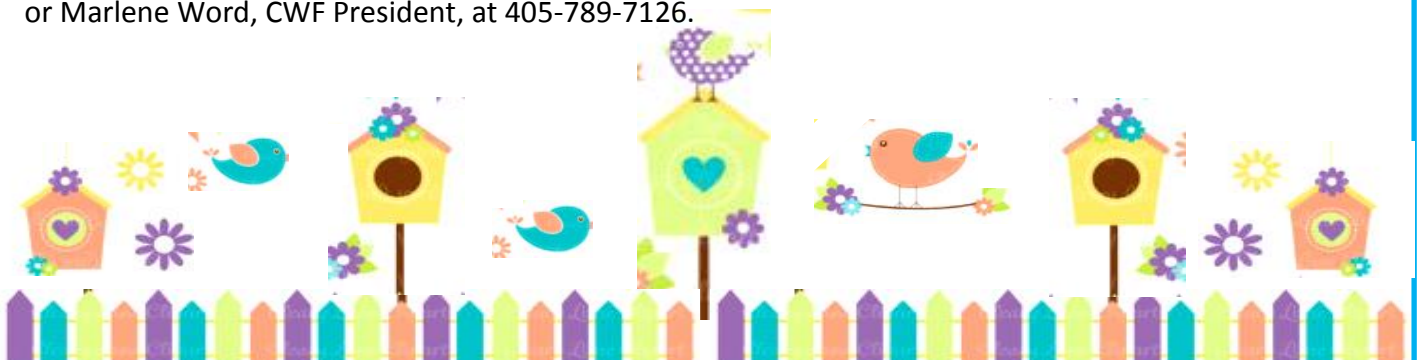
Sunday, March 8, 2015 at 6:00 p.m.
