# The Music We Sing



The music that we sing is an expression of our faith and our beliefs. It is in many ways the heart of our worship. Music can be moving and expressive and definitely encompasses the faith we sing. Whether it is those old, wonderful hymns that we know by heart or something more modern that stirs our soul. I typically ask people to pay attention to what it is we are singing. Sometimes we find songs with great music, a moving beat, a wonderful melody, and catchy words, but sometimes the theology is questionable. I actually once had a minister friend tell me they hated "Amazing Grace" because the song assumes that "he was once lost, or needing saving." For this reason, they said it had bad theology. I disagree and would counter I think it is sung from an individual's experience of how they discovered grace and forgiveness. I believe many can relate.

However, there are songs that are what I call "theologically light" in that they are fun to sing, but the theology is lacking or goes against the teaching we want to lift up. But, sometimes there are also songs that we love that we later question why we sing them when we discover the origins of those songs and discover something more sinister connected to them. In this spirit, Ben Frantz, our Praise Band Leader approached me with an idea to remove all praise songs attributed to Hillsong. He had several people suggest to him that he check out the documentaries that have been made about the megachurch known as Hillsong. This is one of those churches that is designed more like attending a concert and their ministers are treated like celebrities.

The documentary highlighted many things including the songs being designed to make money, but also were designed intentionally to stir emotion, using psychological studies in how to really influence people. Ben spoke with the praise band about the idea that he had to remove these songs from their repertoire and they agreed unanimously. This sparked an interest to watch the documentary for myself. The songs were the basis of the empire that had become Hillsong, run more like a fortune 500 corporation than a church. The documentary describes the songs as hypnotic, and so much has been revealed in recent years of the extent of manipulation and violence toward women happening in this church. I not only concur with Ben and the praise band for their decision to disassociate from this group by removing these songs, I applaud their honest desire to be forward thinking and taking seriously the importance and impact the music we sing has on everyone. If you have questions regarding this, I encourage you to watch one of the documentaries that have been produced. The scary thing is this, one of the ministers who was the primary focus of these documentaries is now serving a church in Oklahoma.

I do want add to this that we do continue to sing our faith and praise God through a joyful noise. Music will always be the heartbeat of our worship services and I am thankful for the musical leadership we have in Ben and Andrew.

### **WOCC** Back to School Bash

I am so proud of Western Oaks Christian Church and the heart for serving our neighbors in demonstration of our love for God. Pat Brown and Fern Melton started a 23rd Street Alliance partnering with the Western Oaks Elementary, Western Oaks Middle School, and Putnam City West High School all of which join Western Oaks Christian Church along 23<sup>rd</sup> Street. We met with the schools in order that we could listen to them sharing what they saw as their greatest needs. They informed us then that 95% of the school population in this area qualifies for free and reduced lunches. From these meetings we collaborated with the schools in planning what supplies were most needed and how we can best help the schools kick off the new school year. We provided 300 bags filled with school supplies, plus over 100 heavy-duty backpacks designed to

carry their laptops. We ran out of school supplies quickly and created a waiting list and provided more bags with more supplies to the schools to deliver to students on the first day of school.





Additionally, through another partnership with another Disciples of Christ ministry called Foster Shoes, we helped them to expand their grant by providing shoes at our event. We have provided 100 pairs of brand new, name brand shoes. All of this was made possible by the various partnerships with other agencies, all coming together to provide resources to local families.

Some of these groups included the girl scouts, Oklahoma City-County Health Department, TSET, Metro Library, OKC Regional Food Bank, the OKC police

department, the local fire department, and many others. We had a number of hair stylists and barbers donate their time providing free haircuts. Each school will also receive a gift card for one lucky student to help get the year off to a great start.

Donations from the Oklahoma Education Credit Union and our bank First Fidelity really helped with supplies and prizes. We also handed out hundreds of hotdogs,

McDonald's hamburgers, happy meals, and Wendy's





donated chili. The whole church showed up, worked hard, served many neighbors and all were exhausted but filled with excitement for the service provided. It is good to be at Western Oaks Christian Church with so many who have a passion for supporting our public education system and have a heart for justice and caring for children and youth!

I am sure I am missing some other great things we did (like games and activities, cheerleaders performing,



girl scouts performing, and Elsa and Anna from Disney's Frozen making surprise appearances). I am so thankful for the school counselors and principals who all participated in planning and being present for this collaborative back to school event! Oh wait, there was more...we also had face painting! So much fun, but even more provided in free resources to the neighborhood through the various people and agencies coming together to support family. All of this would not have been possible

without the grant we received from the Oklahoma Disciples Foundation.

But wait, there is more school fun! Western Oaks Christian Church went to PC West last week to provide our annual back to school breakfast for the teachers. For over 20 years we have been going to the school with the most delicious breakfast casseroles, fruit, Danishes, and so much more and providing a feast for the teachers. We wanted to let them know how very important public education is to us and that we recognize the great responsibility they have taken on to educate these children.





In the words of Fred Rogers, "I believe that appreciation is a holy thing — that when we look for what's best in a person we happen to be with at the moment, we are doing what God does all the time. So in loving and appreciating our neighbor, we are participating in something sacred." As we serve our schools, and our neighbors, and we support the students in the surrounding neighborhoods regardless of demographics, we are

participating in the sacred acts of loving our neighbors as God intended.

Thank you WOCC for being the sacred presence of God in the lives of so many!
