Good News! The New Year is bringing New Opportunities to the Western Oaks Music Ministry, this time with the hopeful return of our Handbell Choir!

A Handbell is an instrument designed to be rung by hand. To ring a handbell, the ringer grasps the bell by its slightly flexible handle and moves the arm to make the hinged clapper strike the inside of the bell. An individual handbell can be used simply as a signal to catch people's attention or summon them together, but handbells are also often heard in tuned sets, and when played together, will enhance our Worship greatly.

It is okay if you can't read Music yet...We will teach you!

If it is difficult for you to stand for a long period of time, it's no problem... You may be seated while playing!

If you need to miss a Rehearsal here and there along the way...It's okay, we are flexible.

Please consider being a part of this wonderful opportunity to Worship together in a new way. There will be a short Informational Meeting about the Handbell Choir, immediately following the 11:00 Worship Service on January 22 in the Sanctuary.
