Simple Things

There is a story told about a man named Rafael Solano. He and several others were living in an impoverished area of Venezuela, and he himself was living with only the clothes on his back. But he had heard of an area where diamonds had been found, and so he joined many other treasure hunters as they sifted through rocks and pebbles of a dried-up riverbed that supposedly had diamonds. Not a single person had any luck as they searched and searched through the sand and pebbles. One by one, everyone who came with dreams of striking it rich, left the site with shattered dreams and exhausted bodies.

After a long time searching, spending weeks sifting sand and pebbles, Solano sat down on a near-by rock and announced he was done. His body couldn't take it anymore, he was exhausted and had nothing to show for the work he had done. One story describes him in this moment saying that he had personally inspected 999,999 pebbles in this river bank and as he bent down to pick up a handful of dirt to emphasize his point he noticed one of the pebbles in his hand looked oddly different from the rest. Could it be?

Sure enough, Solano found what could only be described as a diamond in the rough. It was a "one in a million" chance to uncover what had been mistaken for an ordinary pebble at first only to discover what Harry Winston, a New York Jeweler, valued in the thousands. The year was 1942 and Winston paid \$200,000 who then cut it and polished it and named it the Liberator Diamond, which is considered to be the largest and purest unmined diamond in the world.

We often find the truest gems in our lives in the unlikeliest of places. Sometimes we feel like we just want to give up because we don't see the difference that we are making. Sometimes we feel tired and worn out. However, the message of that diamond in the rough is to never give up. You never know what you will find hidden right in front of you. Matthew 13:32.

May you discover the wonders and joy that your faith brings to fruition even in the smallest of ways. Tiny acts of kindness can feel like hardly perceivably ripples to us, but can become waves of love washing over those receiving that little act of compassion.
