## The Christmas Star

In December 2019, I sang with the Smith County Community Choir in what we affectionately called Lloyd Larson's Christmas Cantata. The theme of that Cantata highlights the Christmas Star:

"The star that shone over Bethlehem so many years ago still shines today to light the way, in the hearts of those who seek the warmth of God's embrace in Jesus Christ, the morning star."

There have been many attempts to explain the Christmas Star over the years. Examples are "a planetary conjunction (6-7 BCE) of Jupiter, Saturn and Mars" or Halley's Comet (12BCE), or a Chinese nova. But the problem with these attempts is that the original language in the Gospel of Matthew specifies an "individual star," and not a constellation of stars. The ancient understanding of birth and death involved the arrival and leaving of a star in the sky. King Herod wanted to know when the star of Jesus appeared so that he would know how old Jesus was, so he could issue his horrible and terrifying order against all the children who were of the same age as Jesus, so he could kill "Rachel's children" and protect his own reign as king (Matt. 2:18). To know when the Christmas star of Jesus first appeared in the sky was critical to Herod's evil plan (Mark 8:15).

One of the oldest commentaries about the Christmas star comes from Ignatius' letter to the Ephesians in the second century CE, section 19: "All the rest of the stars, together with the sun and moon, formed a chorus about the star, but the star itself surpassed them all in its light... all magic was dissolved and every spell was overthrown [that night] because God appeared in human form."

In the forefront of Father Ignatius's mind was the idea that all sorcery, all magic, all superstition, all astrology, even all knowledge, is dispelled by the birth of the Christ Child. When the wise men from the East bowed before the child, they were bowing before a superior force that eclipsed their own, a mysterious knowledge far beyond their own. When we kneel before the Lord of Lords, the King of Kings, the One whose name is above all other names, we carry on a tradition started by these astrologers from the East that the reality of God's love is greater than anything we can ever know or possess.
