Eternal Realities

In a recent "Alice in Wonderland" movie, we encounter a fabulous and mysterious machine known as the Chronosphere which is a metallic globe inside the Grand Clock which powers all Time. During the movie, the Grand Clock begins to slowly power down when the Chronosphere is removed, coming dangerously close to stopping completely and 'freezing Time' forever. Alice and her friends rescue the Grand Clock before this can happen and they are able to 'unfreeze Time,' thereby saving the world as we know it. One of the legends of St. Nicholas places his home at the geographic North Pole, hidden from all forms of radar and scanning, complete with toy factory and reindeer barns. If you ever travel there, however, you must first believe before you can see. Both Wonderland and North Pole Village are what I call 'eternal realities," because they lead us to what is beyond our experience and understanding.

In advanced mathematics, students work with multi-dimensional vectors which they can only imagine but never represent on paper. These 4th and 5th (and larger) dimensions are beyond our seeing, but not beyond our calculations. And the strange thing for those who study these advanced mathematical vectors, is that '1 + 1' may not equal '2' in vector calculation. In order to work with these 'extended' mathematical vectors, we must first believe that they represent something beyond our seeing and hearing. Perhaps the Apostle Paul had one of these vectors in mind when he assigns "Paradise" to a 'third heaven.' (2 Cor. 12:1-4). Paul describes it as a place that no words can describe and like nothing we have ever seen before.

Christmas is not so much a time to 'suspend belief' as it is a time to 'engage belief.' It is a season where we seek what is 'really real' and dispel what is 'falsely real.' When we believe, we can indeed see what we could not see before. When we believe, we can indeed hear what we could not hear before. It reminds me of the song we sing at Christmastide, 'Do you see what I see?' 'Do you hear what I hear?' (A child sleeping in the night shall bring us goodness and light.) Or another of my favorite Christmas songs, 'When a child is born, a rosy hue settles all around and you're on solid ground, but 'for a spell or two, no one seems forlorn.' The eternal reality of the Child in the manger, the One who is God-with-us, changes us inside-out and bottom-side-up, in ways we can no longer ignore. This includes the compassion and love we find in the stories of St. Nicholas as well as the courage and faith we find in the stories of Alice. Our visions and insights find their reality in Christ Jesus, the most real of all that is real. And so, we proclaim together, "Jesus is Lord!" and "Jesus is the reason for our season!"
