Legend of the Paintbrush

Tomie DePaola, a well-known Irish-Italian children's book author from Connecticut, once wrote a book entitled, The Legend of the Indian Paintbrush. It records the story of a Native-American boy named 'Little Gopher' who had a dream-vision that he would one day paint a canvas with colors as pure as the evening sunset. As he was smaller and less athletic than the other boys in the tribe, the Shaman encouraged him to fulfill his dream as a painter for the tribe, recording their great events in color to give honor to their generation. As he grew older, he first acquired a beautifully white canvas made of buckskin and then began to search for the brightest flowers of the prairie, the reddest berries, the yellowest stones, the deepest purple inside the rocks, and the greenest leaves with which to paint. But, try as he might, none of his trial paintings could even come close to the colors of the sunset. Still, Little Gopher persisted in painting the great events of his People and was faithful to his calling despite the limitations of his colors. One day, while he was walking in the hills alongside the camp, he came across some painting brushes made of animal hairs and horse tails unlike any he had ever seen before sticking out of the ground and ready to use. Each brush had a color that matched a color in the sunset. Eagerly, he gathered them and began painting with bold and beautiful colors his dreamed masterpiece of the sky. He left the brushes on the hillside and brought his masterpiece down to the camp for everyone to see. Those who saw his painting began to say that he had captured the sunset and brought it to the earth, so brilliant were the colors. The storytellers began to speak of the miracle of the brushes on the hillside, how the brushes turned into beautiful wildflowers of fire across the landscape of the natural hills, and how God had blessed the People with an eternal beauty and a blessed vision.

As we look forward to Mother's Day, Graduation Sunday and Memorial Day, let's think of our own Dream-visions for a color-full future in our fellowship and worship. God has blessed us with an eternal beauty and everlasting joy in the risen Christ. We too can capture some of the sunset and bring it down to earth in our ceremonies, as well as in our Earth Day and Eastertide celebrations of Spring. We too can seek and find the colors of the rainbow in our family reunions and memorial honors. We can build a human peace with the divine glory embedded in the colors of the Native-American Paintbrush for a more satisfying and flourishing world in honor to Christ Jesus, our Lord. Alleluia!

Transition Update

We are now entering the next phase in our transition to a new Senior Minister. Although the transition may appear to some to be playing out in slow motion, we are in keeping with the suggested timeline as described by Pam Holt, the recently retired Regional Minister who visited with the Administrative Committee in January before her departure. For their part, members of the Administrative Committee are meeting on a weekly basis to manage this special time of transition while maintaining regular affairs of the congregation.

The next, all-important phase is the appointment of a Senior Minister Search Committee.

According to the provisions in the WOCC Bylaws:

a. In the event of a vacancy in the Senior Minister position a Senior Minister Search Committee shall be formed. The Committee shall be composed of seven members, including the Personnel Committee Chairperson. The other members shall be nominated by the Administrative Committee and confirmed by the Board. The Search Committee shall be responsible for recommending a prospective minister to the Board and shall remain intact until completion of its task.

Members of the search committee are persons called and set aside by the congregation for the task of seeking new pastoral leadership. Serving on a search committee is a spiritual calling – to represent the people of God in a particular congregation, at a particular time in their life, in the search for a servant of God to lead them into the future as faithful people of God.

In this calling, members of the search committee represent the whole church. Therefore, they need to be persons who are knowledgeable of and committed to the heritage and practices of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ); who will command the respect and trust of the congregation to be objective in assessing both the church's future and potential candidates, make sound judgments, represent the congregation fairly to prospective candidates, and **keep confidentiality**; and who are committed to providing continuing leadership after the new minister arrives.

The task of the Search Committee is significant to the life and future of the congregation. The work and decisions of the search committee will have a lasting effect. In faithful performance of their callings, the Administrative and Search Committees need to constantly seek the council and guidance of God through prayer and devotion and seek the support and intercession of the congregation in their public and private prayers.


