After the game, fireworks lit up the sky, cars were honking cheer, and grown men and women were weeping for joy in ways that they had not done before and likely will not do again for many years to come. The Cubs manager, Joe Maddon, in a moment of special inspiration, proclaimed that the proverbial curse had finally been lifted. He finally noted, at the end of his remarks, that something very different from the usual was happening in the dugout at the end of that wonderful and strange day of baseball. "It's a lot of gratitude, it's the same refrain from everybody. For the most part, they don't want an autograph or a picture. They just want to shake your hand and say thank you." It had been a team effort; no one player stood out from the rest very much, not enough to surround any one player with cheering autograph seekers. The entire team glowed with gratitude.

G. K. Chesterton once wrote: "Gratitude is happiness doubled by wonder." I think the Chicago Cubs set the model that day in 2016 when they celebrated a team effort that had taken them to the brink of failure and success and landed them on the other side. Just when they might have wanted to give up hope and lose yet one more time, a pitcher, a catcher, an outfielder, an infielder, breathed deeply and doubled their efforts together at the right time to win. And, at the end of the day, silent gratitude spoke the fullness of joy. As we begin our search for a new 'settled' pastor, I hope that we will take a long grateful moment and give thanks to God for our past and our future.

Priya Parker writes in The Art of Gathering, "that what we build together should be both memorable and transformable," and "has to start with a real need," and "has to feel like us." Real power does not lie in the power of large organizations, or the power of empires, or the power of nature, or the power of nuclear fission or fusion. Real power lies with God and always has. We are badly deceived if we think that it lies anywhere else. Real power does not lie in arrogance or recklessness, but in humility, love and compassion. This power is not self-referential, but other-minded. This is the "quantum" power that transforms planets and solar systems and galaxies with the healing power of Christ.
