Two Pledges

On May 19th, we celebrated the birthday of Christ's church and on July 4th we will celebrate the birthday of our nation. The church is almost 2000 years old; our nation only 248 years old. As many other congregations across our land, we have both a Christian flag and a United States flag in the sanctuary. In these halls, members have recited pledges to both flags:

"I pledge allegiance to the Christian flag and to the Savior for whose kin[g]dom it stands, one family, uniting all Christians in service and love."

"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

It is our endearing hope that we never have to choose one flag over the other, for both pledges are enduring in our hearts for different reasons. Both pledges represent the best inside of us, our best natures regarding grace and freedom. And, of course, it is often the best of our young men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice for us, whether that be dying in action or returning with severe spiritual and physical wounds. A famous preacher once said, "We fear the good and the best inside us, and among us, because they are so demanding of us. In crucifying our Savior, Jesus Christ, we crucified the best that God has to offer, perfect and beautiful, yet the saddest part of this is that we could only do so because we had first crucified the best within ourselves." Would we not rather recover the best inside ourselves and restore our respect for the best among us? Resurrection is, in part, the name we give to recovering and restoring the best, recognizing the best within ourselves and within others, within those who have given their lives for God and country.

There is a parable from India that gives us an example: There was an ancient tree that grew on the edge of the swamp with long roots going deep into the ground and far into the swamp. An old man sat beside the tree with a young boy watching him. The old man notices a scorpion caught in the roots of the tree where the roots wrap around each other a few feet out into the swamp and slightly above the water line; he ventures out into the swamp to free the struggling scorpion. And as he works on separating the scorpion from the roots of the tree, he is stung badly on both of his hands so that he has to go back to the shore to wash off his swollen hands and treat his wounds. Seeing the old man's hands so swollen, the boy comes over and asks the man why he was so foolish as to try to rescue the scorpion so far out into the swamp, knowing that he would be stung severely. The old man replied: "the scorpion's nature is to sting, but my nature is to save. I had to be true to my own nature regardless of what the scorpion might do."




5th Sunday Offering Boxes may be returned by June 30th
