# People of the Wind

On the grounds of the Kansas State Capitol in Topeka is a memorial to the Kansa Tribe of Native Americans whom the Spaniards found living in the Kansas River Valley in the early 1700s. The memorial explains that the word "Kansa" translates to "People of the Wind." The phrase is poetic, in my mind, as I think about the strong winds I have experienced over the years while living in Kansas (and Oklahoma as well). These winds, and the people who navigated through them over multiple generations, provide the backdrop to the varied events in the history of aviation in this region, and to the importance of aviation in our industrial expansion. Yes, we too are 'people of the wind,' inheriting the legacy of those who came before us. There are windmills across mid-America, both past and present, that are a tribute to how our pioneers navigated the prairie winds to provide for their families. Our local area firefighters are required to 'tame' that same wind to fight and put out the many wildfires that threaten our lives and livelihoods.

In fact, as communities of faith, we might choose to call ourselves 'people of the wind.' We are, after all, 'people of the Spirit,' the Body of Christ held together by the work of the Holy Spirit. To be 'born of the Spirit' is to be 'born of the wind' which blows where it chooses, not giving us any hints 'where it comes from or where it goes.' (John 3:8). To be 'born from above (or born again)' is to be born of the God who 'rides on the wings of the wind.' (Ps. 104:3). A scholar named J.B. Phillips once posed a question to us: 'Is your God too small?' We limit God by nailing down the power of God to our own preconceived notions. If the wind analogy tells us anything, it tells us that we cannot control the size of God, or limit God's power or choices in creation. God creates however God wants; God chooses what God chooses with a larger viewpoint than ours.. To be 'people of the wind' is to understand that God is unlimited in power and in grace, and to be stewards of the mystery (1 Cor. 4:1-7) behind the coming and going of the wind. To be 'people of the wind' is to recognize the invisible with our faith and the impossible with our hope.

God be with you and your family this month as we celebrate our independence and our inheritance as 'people of the wind.'

In addition to making coffee by the cup, the commercial-grade coffeemaker will provide coffee in 2.5 liter pump air pots that can be easily transported to meeting rooms or events throughout the building. It is not too early to start thinking about taking home the many coffee makers (8? maybe 10?) that are stashed and taking up much needed space in cupboards and closets around the church.






The Life Lessons Sunday School class has graciously offered to serve yummy pancakes to everyone!!
