Filling the Gaps

You may be familiar with one of the New York Times Best Seller Books called 29 Gifts in 29 Days: the Challenge to a month of Giving by Cami Walker. It is a challenge to each of us to learn about the South African philosophy known as "Ubuntu" which means something to the effect "I can only be me when I remember I am connected to others." The book challenges us to give a gift each day for a month, the gift may be flowers or laughter or smiles or the gift of your time or your listening. There are multiple forms of giving that qualify; the important thing is that you give mindfully and intentionally each day. The promise is that at the end of the month of giving we will be transformed by the process of giving, and as a result, also learn how to receive graciously. The grace of God comes to us both in giving and receiving, and it is important that we learn how to do both well.

"Out of (Christ's) fullness we have all received grace upon grace," (John 1:16) grace in place of grace already given. The sense of this passage in Greek is that we have received an infinite measurement of grace, grace upon grace, upon grace, upon grace, and so on to infinity. Grace accumulates, carrying forward past grace into a larger amount of grace tomorrow. At the Table of Presence in the First Testament Tabernacle, thanksgiving involves giving a gift to God that, in turn, becomes a gift from God. No, we cannot simply skip the giving in order to go directly to the receiving. We cannot simply give a gift to ourselves and skip God's Table of Presence. To fully appreciate grace, we have to make the entire round-trip, from thanksgiving to thanks-receiving and back again. Gratitude is a full-circle experience!

In what seems to have become his legacy, Will Rogers smilingly informed us that the stranger, native or otherwise, with customs different from our own, is a potential friend we have not yet met. We might say, that to pre-give someone is to forgive with an edge toward understanding, or to pre-receive, a prayer toward anticipation of what does not yet exist, but might exist if we plan our steps carefully. Creation out-of-nothing (ex nihilo), as tradition says, may simply be a way of arriving at the finish line before we begin the race, or leaving the starting line after we have already finished the race. And so it is with our seeking a new settled minister, we welcome someone who potentially will help us expand our love into a fuller version of ourselves. It will take some pre-giving and some pre-receiving as we make our way forward in faith. And, yes, it is true that by giving the right gifts to our neighbors we give the right gifts to ourselves.

Coffee, Tea, or...

Visitors in the Coffee Fellowship area got their first look at a project that is 5 years in the making, but now in the home stretch toward completion. Under the sheets are the components of a new Coffee Bar that will soon be in operation. Designed to be consistent with other architectural woodworked features in the building, the coffee bar will feature storage space for supplies, separate high volume and individual coffee production appliances, and hot water dispensing for non -coffee beverages. The high-capacity coffee makers will dispense into Airpot Lever-action canisters that allow several liters of coffee to be transported to other locations in the building for meetings and gatherings. The Coffee brewer will be directly plumbed into the existing water supply and can produce 4 to 7 gallons of coffee per hour, using water that has been processed through a high efficiency reverse osmosis filtering system. There will also be a sink installed with a pull down spray faucet.

Funding for the coffee bar project comes from the Memorial Fund, a special designated fund collected from memorial gift contributions which is designated to be used for special projects to enhance the church. The Memorial Bells are an example of a special project funded by Memorial Funds. You may donate to this fund for any occasion to honor friends or family, living or passed, and provide a lasting enhancement to WOCC.

Water?

Several months ago, it became apparent that Bi-level ADA compliant water coolers near the office and Schwind Hall had problems. Persistent leaks and water flow issues necessitated their removal. Perhaps you have seen the signs on the wall asking you to Watch this Space! At one point, there was serious consideration to use the space for the coffee bar location but our resident architectural consultant,



Dave Brown, noted the location is a high-traffic area and unsuitable for four-way human traffic flow of older and middle-aged adults and slow and fast moving youngsters. After an inspection and some great work by a local plumber, things are all set for installing replacement water coolers. This set has an upgrade feature in that there is a bottle filling station attached. No more tilting you water bottle to catch the water stream while trying to not have any overflow. This bottle filler is hands -free and delivers 8 gallons per hour of cool, filtered water!

Funding for the water fountain replacement come from the cash-back reward feature of our church credit card. Our rewards balance covered the entire purchase price of the water coolers, but only a portion of the installation.
