nicely paved roads in the park itself which made for an interesting contrast with the ruins. On our way back home, we ate at the Pueblo Kitchen (attached to the Pueblo Center in Albuquerque); this was truly a wonderful delight! Susan and I had the roasted pinion triple berry salad with raspberry vinaigrette dressing. She drank Zia Ginger Ale and I had Zia Root Beer, both natively developed. After eating, we visited the local store. One of the books I found there was entitled: The

Soul Would Have No Rainbow If the Eyes had no Tears. It is a book of Native American proverbs

hundreds of years in time for every mile we navigated. Ruby Ranch's fake longhorn watched over our journey as cattle on the property had right-of-way. And, wouldn't you know it, there were

#### **Roofing update**

Roofing contract was signed with Elliott Roofing. We accepted their recommendation to replace the composite shingles with a color that closely resembles what is currently installed. The damage estimate from the assessor did not identify any damage to the membrane barrier that is the building's primary protection against the rain. Shingle replacement over Schwind Hall, the Sanctuary, the Burke Outbuilding, and the shake shingles over the north and east perimeter of the building is the primary focus of this project. No word yet as to when they expect to start work.

#### **Search Committee orientation**

The Search Committee met with Interim Regional Minister Randy Kuss on August 4<sup>th</sup> following the second service. Search Committee members, along with a few interested congregants were in attendance. The pizza and salad were great! The first step for the committee is to develop the Congregational Profile. #### **Coffee Bar**


