It speaks volumes that many have objected to calling the current First Lady, "Dr. Jill," even though she has certainly earned it. The question is, 'will we be, like Moses, unable to enter into the promised land of our change? Will others inherit the change we cannot achieve?'

At the beginning of the church (Pentecost), Luke recorded in Acts 2:47, "And the Lord kept adding to their number daily those who were being saved." We should notice in this verse, that it does not say "those who were saved," but "those who were being saved." In my opinion, this is not a trivial distinction. In 1993, Herbert Anderson put forth his proposal that our divorce rate would be significantly reduced if we think of ourselves as "becoming married," rather than "being married." And yet, speaking proleptically, we are NOT as ones half-graced, half-forgiven, half-saved. Yes, to-day, we can claim the fullness of that which we seek while on the way to it.

Be patient and allow grace to work its wonderful power!
