Shamrock Theology

When I think of March, I think of the shamrock. It has been one of my favorite plants to have in my yard in the "Irish" Spring. The ancient Celtic peoples thought it possessed a magical power citing the three dominions of earth, sky, and sea. Some even thought the shamrock could predict the weather—when its leaves turned skyward, a storm was brewing. It is known as the "badge" of Ireland because, at one point, the Irish used it as a symbol of rebellion. It has been the symbol of St. Patrick's Day (March 17th) because legend tells us that Patrick used the 3-leaf clover as an evangelistic tool to explain the theology behind the Holy Trinity, that there are three faces to the one God. (When there are four (4) leaves to the clover, the fourth leaf represents God's grace.) Legend also tells us that when Patrick drove the snakes out of Ireland, he had a cross in one hand and a sprig of shamrocks in the other.

In Jeremiah 1:11, the prophet identifies in God's vision a tree that is sometimes called the "Waker tree." This tree is meant to be a call to 'spiritual watching' for the young Jeremiah as he awaits the 'awakening' of God's Word. What is interesting about this tree is that the blossoms of this tree (i.e. Almond or Hazel Tree) actually appear before its leaves do. During Lent, this might be a warning not to get ahead of ourselves in our spiritual journey toward Easter, but it might also be an alert that God's Easter Love always precedes God's Judging Love. Like the young Jeremiah, we too are called to be 'spiritual watchers,' waiting for the shamrock's leaves to turn earthward, and the Cross to fall into the Empty Tomb. My hope is that we will allow God to bury "Good-Friday-Deep" all our loneliness, anger, addictions, arguments, fears, sin, grief, despair, and guilt—that we will leave the empty tomb with a Hazel blossom and a four-leaf clover through our Lord Jesus Christ.


