# A Well-Taught Tongue

"The Lord has given me a well-taught tongue that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning, God wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught." (Is. 50:4)

It is best, says Isaiah, to have a well-taught tongue. Consider your words, your language, your tone, before you speak, as to how they will be received by the hearer. The poet, Robert Frost, once said that 'the ear is the best reader.' How will it sound to the one being spoken to?

A well-taught tongue is one that has had many failures over the years in order to finally get it right. Theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes that we should hold our tongue rather than loosen it, not saying much of what occurs to one to say. Kansas Leadership Center in Wichita lists as one of the characteristics of good leadership that we count to 10 before speaking and give our brains time to catch up with our emotions. Having a 'well-taught tongue is like having a 'bridled tongue,' (James 1:26; Psalm 39:1); such a tongue has calculated the cost of its message and is efficiently used. On the other hand, when your tongue is sharpened (not well-taught), it produces all manner of cruel words that are like deadly arrows (Ps. 64:3).

You know when someone is in touch with your world, and when not. The words ring true. They carry weight. They are of the right language for the culture and the moment. They are spoken when you are ready to hear them, not before, not after. They satisfy your desperate need to know. They relieve your panic and answer your most persistent questions. They ease your exhaustion, massage your fatigued muscles. They come at the right time and in the right manner. Proverbs 15:23 says: 'How good and delightful is a word spoken at the right moment! There is joy in giving an appropriate answer. We are sometimes told there is a difference between what sounds logical and what is sound logic. But it is also true that they often are the same. An answer must sound right to us, if we are to hear it, as much as being right, in and of itself.

When I think back to all the teachers in my life, I am humble and thankful that they were part of my growing years. They sacrificed so that I might gain. They taught me persistence so that I might keep trying until I get it right, that I might stay in the race even if I finish dead last, so that I know that I made it through, even though I so much wanted to quit and walk away. They lifted me on their shoulders so I could see the road ahead. As Paul once wrote, 'I gave you a part of myself, so precious had you become to me.' (1 Thess. 2:8). Please join me this month is giving thanks for the many teachers in our lives!


